Regulations

It's mandatory for the participants to read and understand Vuelta Ciclista a Lanzarote regulations. The organisation can disqualify any participant that does not respect these considerations.

The regulations applicable to the event will be governed by:

UCI and RFEC

UCI Regulations for Cycling in its <u>Chapter XV "CYCLING FOR ALL"</u>, and the Royal Spanish Cycling Federation technical regulations, <u>X</u> -<u>Regulations for Cycling for All</u>.

General Traffic Regulations

General Traffic Regulations and specific instructions for dynamic sports events on the road as well as specific instructions for road cycling events, published by the General Directorate of Traffic.

The event will take place on roads where certain sections will be closed to traffic, while in other sections, only the lane for cyclists will be closed, and in some sections, regular traffic will be allowed.

In the latter case, participants will be considered normal users of public roads, subject to the general rules of the Road Safety Law. In both of these cases, participants must always ride in their lane responsibly and with care."

Specific regulations of the Vuelta Ciclista a Lanzarote

The organization reserves the right to make changes to these

regulations if deemed necessary, and such changes will be communicated on the <u>Vuelta Ciclista a Lanzarote website</u> and through social media channels <u>@clublasantaraces</u>

- 1. All participants must have a valid **Spanish Cycling Federation License** (Cycling or Cyclo-tourism) for the year 2024 or pay the one-day license fee to participate.
- 2. Participants will be identified with a wristband, bike plate and electronic timing chips strapped around their ankle for security controls, intermediate checkpoint timing, and final timing.



- 3. The registered person will only be able to **participate with the bike plate** that has been assigned to him/her and agrees not to allow other people to use it.
- 4. **Teams.** Participants can participate as a team. It must be a team of four members, either male, female or mixed (2 males and 2 females). The team score will be calculated using the times of each team member in each stage. Participants can only be part of one team and team members will also be eligible for individual recognitions.
- 5. Participants will not be allowed to start the event if they do not have the following **equipment**:
 - A. Approved and rigid helmet.
 - B. Proper clothing for weather conditions (glasses, windproof jacket, arm and leg warmers).
 - C. Sufficient water/food for 50km.
 - D. Mobile device with the emergency number of the Vuelta Ciclista:
 +34 686 033 472
 - E. Rear light.
- 6. The event route will be clearly marked to guide participants along the planned course. Information and signage will be provided at the most challenging points, areas where there's a risk of getting lost, aid stations, and more. It is the **participant's responsibility to locate and follow the signage.**
- 7. Cyclists may only receive external assistance from the organization (support vehicles, water, food, spare parts, etc.) during the ride and exclusively at the designated aid stations.
- 8. There will be established **time limits** (cuts-off) for passing several points along the route. If participants arrive at one of these points beyond the time limit and get overtaken by the official **"End of Event"**

sweep vehicle, they will be considered out of the event **(DNF)**. The organization will arrange transportation for both the participant and their bike to the finish line.

- 9. The time trial segments are the only competitive sections of the ride. Since this is a non-competitive event, its purpose is to provide an opportunity to socialize and enjoy without competitive pressure.
- 10. If a participant needs to abandon Vuelta Ciclista a Lanzarote for any reason, they must inform the organization to ensure their well-being and coordinate assistance to the end of the route if needed.



Participants can contact the organization members on the course or the sweep vehicle team at the end of the group.

11. Lanzarote is a Biosphere Reserve, and it is the responsibility of all participants to **preserve the environment.** Therefore, it is strictly prohibited, under the penalty of disqualification, to litter or discard waste outside the designated refreshment points.

Important:

It is mandatory for each cyclist to ensure, before participating in the Vuelta Ciclista a Lanzarote, that they are in **perfect health** conditions and fit for the physical and mental effort required to complete it.

Each cyclist participates at their own risk and by accepting the present regulations at the time of registration, declares that they are in **suitable physical and health conditions to undertake the cycling event**, as well as having sufficient technical skills to face the route, such as steep slopes, winding descents, sections with other vehicles on the road, etc.

Under no circumstances will **the organizer** be responsible for accidents or health problems of a participant related to their participation in the Vuelta Ciclista a Lanzarote, in any of its distances or modalities.

Categories

Categories will be based on the participant's age as of December 31st of the event year.

Age Groups:

- Cadets: 15 & 16 years old (can only participate in Stage 2).
- Juniors: 17 & 18 years old.
- Sub 23: 19 to 22 years old.
- Elite: 23 to 29 years old.
- Master 30: 30 to 39 years old.
- Master 40: 40 to 49 years old.
- Master 50: 50 to 59 years old.
- Master 60: 60 to 75 years old.

Stage 1 and 2: All athletes from the Junior category to the Master 60 category can participate.

Stage 2: athletes in the Cadet category can participate with authorization from their parents or guardians.

Registration

On Friday 27th September 2024, the athlete pack collection will take place from 14:00 to 19:30 at the Square, Club La Santa. Participants and companions can enjoy a Welcome Cocktail from 15:00 to 19:30 at the same location.

What to bring?

- 1. PHOTO IDENTIFICATION.
- 2. **INSURANCE.** You must present A or B:
- A. License for competitive cycling. Participants who are in possession of a license for competitive cycling will be requested to show it in digital

format or hard copy.

Foreign Participants with a Cycling Federation License (Cycling or Cyclo-tourism) for 2024:

In addition to the license, foreign participants must provide a written authorization from their national federation.

a.This authorization must certify that their insurance is valid for the event: Vuelta Ciclista a Lanzarote (28.09 - 29.09.2024).



- b. The document must be presented during onsite registration on September 27th to collect the bib number.
- B. **1 Day License.** Participants who are not in possession of a license for competitive cycling (RFEC or FCC licence), must apply for a temporary license valid only for the competition, approved by the Royal Spanish Cycling Federation (RFEC).
 - a.Participants can purchase it with their **online registration**. Price: 10€ for 1 stage or 2 stages
 - b. Participants can purchase it on the onsite registration.
 Price: 15€ for 1 stage or 2 stages

Can't go to the registration?

You have 2 options:

- A. Someone else collects your athlete pack*. They will need to present:
 - A written authorisation
 - A copy of their PHOTO IDENTIFICATION
 - *The person collecting another participant's athlete pack won't be able to take the wristband. The participant him/herself will have to collect it before starting the stage at the Info Point.
- B. Collect it yourself at the information tent:
 - Saturday 28th: from 7:30 at The Stadium in Club La Santa
 - Sunday 29th: from 7:30 at Plaza de La Naciones (Puerto del Carmen).

What do I get when I register?






